The fly pattern for January is the **Intruder**. Use your favorite colors to come up with a winning fly for this month's contest. Here are a couple of pictures, along with one recipe (there are many).



RECIPE:

Hook: Mustad 79580, 36890 #1 and up
(Used as a foundation only as the bend and point are cut off)

Trailing Hook: #1 Up Eye Octopus Hook

Thread: Gudebrod 8/0 or 6/0 Black

Loop: Fireline (60lb, 50lb or 30lb)

Tail: Chartreuse Polar Bear Hair

Rear Hackle: Chartreuse Polar Bear Under Fur
Followed By a Large Webby Pheasant Rump
Feather Dyed Black

Body: Peacock Green Mylar

Body Hackle: Black Neck Hackle

Rib: Fine Gold Wire

Front Hackle: Chartreuse Polar Bear Under Fur
Followed By a Large Webby Pheasant Rump
Feather Dyed Black

Wing: Black Ostrich

Collar: Chartreuse Guinea Fowl

Eyes: Dumbbell Eyes
