2009 NW Youth Conservation and Fly Fishing Academy 2009 NW Youth Conservation and Fly Fishing Academy - Mike Clancy, WSCFFF

There was no finer opportunity for 20 youth, ages 12-16, to learn about conservation and fly fishing than at this serious, no nonsense, seven day fly fishing experience. Dick Nye, the founder of the Academy, has done an incredible job organizing this 100% volunteer event. The students bunked in cabins at the Gwinwood Conference Center on Hicks Lake in Lacey, WA. along with their advisors. The June 21-27, 2008 event was sponsored by the Olympia Chapter of TU, the Federation of Fly Fishers and the South Sound Fly Fishers of Olympia, WA. Some of the students were sponsored by various fly fishing organizations throughout the State of Washington.

Jim Wilcox, President of the Olympia Chapter of TU, Mark Taylor, President of the Washington Council of Trout Unlimited, Carl Johnson, President of the Washington State Council FFF, along with Gary Kellog, President of the South Sound Fly Fishers, were invited to speak at the Opening Ceremonies.

To develop the student's fly fishing skills, the 20 students were divided into three groups rotating through the three skill development sessions in casting, fly tying and knot tying.

Wake up was at 6am, with classes and various activities all day till lights out at 11pm. Half of the students were transported by volunteers to the local Deschutes River for evening fishing, while the other half fished the Nisqually Pond at 6am in the morning.

The fly tying classes were conducted by Janet Schimpf and Karen Royer, assisted by Ron and Vickie Eagle Elk, all well known, expert fly tyers. The casting classes were conducted by Mel Hurd, SSFF and assisted by members from the local fly fishing organizations, South Sound Fly Fishers and Puget Sound Fly Fishers. Conservation classes were taught by well qualified experts from various organizations throughout the area.

Major contributors to the event were Cabela's, Sportsman's Warehouse, and Office Max. The WSCFFF awarded each student with a one year youth membership to the Federation of FlyFishers. The Olympia Chapter of TU presented each student with a rod and reel including a floating line.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. We encourage you to release the majority of fish caught to insure a future fishery. In case of two equal fish caught in the same category, the released fish will take priority. Please, don't enter spawning fish.
2. Time frame for affidavits is Nov.1 of one year and continues to Oct. 31 of the following year. Present this affidavit to the Awards Committee Chairman no later than Oct. 31.
3. Fish must be caught on a cast fly, using conventional fly lines (no lead core) and leaders with only one fly. Barbless hooks are preferable.
4. Awards will be presented for the largest fish in each category.
