The Presidents Message

In stanza 11 of the poem Locksley Hall, (1835) Sir Alfred Lord Tennyson wrote, "...In the Spring a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of love."

Yeah, yeah, yeah... That's great stuff, but here's the thing, I say, "In the spring a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of fishing!"
(And of course love too)

For several of our "young and in love" members both Pass Lake and Lone Lake have started to put out some fish. That's exciting! I first fished Lone Lake in the middle 70's; I have enjoyed this fishery for decades. It appeared there may have been some serious winter kill at Lone Lake but it has become obvious now that this is not the case.

The FFF has a program in which they will donate a rod to our club when we sign up new members. If 12 of our club members join the FFF we get a TFO Lefty Kreh Professional Series rod and if 18 of our members join the FFF we get a TiCR X Series rod.

The rod could be something that we check out to members to try or we could possibly include it in our auction. Either way I think the new chairperson of the Education Committee should get to be the first person to try the rod. Since O'Clare Enstad seems to be (rapidly) losing interest in this position I think it is safe to say the position is officially open. Members of the Conservation Committee are working on a job description for this new position.

If we sign up 12 new members for the FFF, and if you volunteer to chair the committee you could be the first one to try the new rod. How cool is that?!

At our last membership meeting we had 67 people present. Of those in attendance 38 people bought dinner. We guarantee 40 at each meeting. Currently we charge \$15 for dinner. That covers the cost of the meal being served and the cost of the room rental. Certainly I'm not saying that everyone has to purchase dinner. What is currently happening is that the people who purchase dinner are subsidizing the cost of the room rental for everyone. We are not likely to be able to continue this arrangement. Moveable Feast, who caters our dinners, has lost their lease at the hotel. We are currently in the process of looking for a new meeting site. I come to the meetings for fellowship with people who enjoy fly fishing, to learn something, and to contribute something. I don't expect to get a dinner like I would get if I went out with my wife to Anthony's. If the dinner at our club meetings is just "kind of blah" I think, "So what..." Again, we are not likely to be able to continue the current arrangement.



Since our last membership meeting I have traveled over Snoqualmie Pass twice. There were people skiing but the road was bare. Warmer days are near.

Eastern March Brown: Size 10 – 14

The March Brown's large size and its awkwardness to gain flight during emergence make it the ideal meal for any trout.

When fishing this pattern representing the Dun, be prepared for aggressive action as trout will jump clear out of the water when taking this fly. Fish this pattern in and around river structure and along the banks in shallow water. An occasional light twitch of the rod will mimic the fluttering of the Dun as it dries its wings and prepares for flight.

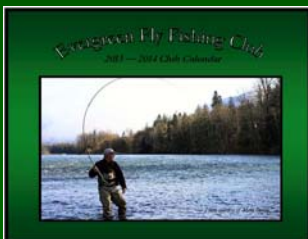
The spring outing is coming up on May17-19.

Rules and Regulations

We encourage you to release the majority of fish caught to insure a future fishery. In case of two equal fish caught in the same category, the first fish caught will take priority. Please, don't enter spawning fish.

Time frame for affidavits is Nov. 1 of one year and continues to Oct. 31 of the following year. Present this affidavit to the Awards Committee Chairman no later than Oct 31.

Fish must be caught on a cast fly.

Awards will be presented for the largest fish in each category.
