The Bloodworm



Keeping your bloodworm pattern within a foot or two off any bottom structure is good strategy as bloodworms will not stray to far from home. Because midge larvae get around by squirming through the water, anglers should give good animation when retrieving their flies. An excellent retrieve when hung under an indicator is two very short but quick strips, then leaving the fly alone to settle back down for a period. This action seems to draw the attention of nearby feeding trout and will often result in hook-ups once the fly is either dropping back down or has settled back to a resting state. With that said, at times no movement is required at all and just leaving your presentation still can produce well.

Casting Clinic

When it comes to fly casting, timing is everything.

That was among the advice provided by Don Simonson Aug. 3 during the club's fifth class on fly casting. It focused on having success with single-handed rods.

Simonson, a member of the International Federation of Fly Fishing's casting board of governors, is co-chair of the state FFF's casting program and a member of the Washington and Methow Valley fishing clubs.

About 16 members, friends, and family met at Blue Stilly park on the Stillaguamish River on a Saturday morning mostly to shore up basic casting skills and to learn some more advance casts like the double haul.

Members **Paul Wiltberger**, **Dale Dennis**, and **Chris Grieve** were on hand to help and add pointers as needed.

Probably the most common problem was timing. with lots of folks just trying to do things too fast. Not pausing long enough on the back cast to let it straighten out was probably the number one mistake.

Wiltberger noted that if you don't do the basics perfectly, the more advanced casts, like the double haul, will fail.

Simonson spent most of the three-hour cast offering basic advice and providing counts and key words to help casters with their timing.

Wiltberger has not scheduled another class yet and would like to hear from members about whether they would like more classes and about what they should cover.



Because of the success of bringing in an expert like Simonson, Wiltberger said he may try to bring in an outside instructor for double-handed spey rods. But he's curious about what members would like, so don't hesitate to let him know at the next meeting if you would like the classes to continue and what you'd like them to cover.
